RABBI'S MESSAGE

On Sefirat haOmer - Redemption comes slowly, growing day by day

At the Passover Seder the possibility of redemption is close, almost tangible, as we remember how God brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand, decisively affecting on our entire history. But after Pesach, and between Jewish holidays it's easy to pause our sense of Jewish learning and growth. That's why God invented the Omer. During the 50 days between Pesach and Shavuot, the days during which the children of Israel were on a journey out of Egypt, through the sea, and toward "the Mountain of God" we too embark upon the spiritual journey that prepares us for the encounter with God at Sinai. During this time it is common practice (not to mention a *mitzvah*) to count off the fifty days until Shavuot (Lev 23:15-16). We do it in the evening after sunset, between the second day of Pesach and the evening of Shavuot. Because the Torah uses the imperative, "You shall count!" we even precede the counting with a blessing: "Blessed are you, Adonai our God, Lord of the Universe, who has sanctified us through your commandments and commanded us to count the Omer." This year, I want to suggest a particular "rif" on that practice.

Why should we count off the fifty days? Beyond that the Torah commands it, I can think of several good reasons, but one is the most important: Redemption does not happen all at once. According to the Sages, Israel in Egypt was sunk in the deepest level of separation from God - the forty-ninth level of *Tumah* טומא. Yet, during the 50 days between leaving Egypt and coming to Mt. Sinai, Israel are understood to

have risen through the forty-nine levels or gates of understanding such that they were prepared to receive Torah. The fiftieth rung is the perception of God himself. Just think, that is what they perceived at the moment that God spoke the first command: "I am God!" The great medieval commentator, Nachmanides (aka Ramban) writes in his introduction to *Bereishit*, "Our sages taught, 'Fifty gates of understanding were created in the world, and all were transmitted to Moses with one exception (Rosh Hashanah 21b), as it is said: "You have made him a little lower than the angels.' (Ps 8:6). ... In the creation of the world there are fifty gates of understanding. It is as if it said that there is one gate of understanding pertaining to [each of the aspects of] the creation. ... This number is clearly alluded to in the counting of the *Omer* and in the counting of the *Yovel* year." If there are fifty *gates of wisdom* for Creation, then perhaps there are for the Omer as well. This suggests a practice of daily reflection to me.

Though we, like the Israelites may not know the shortest path, at least know where we are going! Sinai is the destination. Sinai is called the "wedding day of Hashem and his people." (*Shir ha Shirim* 3:11 and Rashi on the verse) On this day, God spoke the *Anokhi* (I) of the first command, and celebrated his deliverance *asher hotzetikha meretz mitzrayim, mibayt avadim*, "who has brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage. "As *Ramban* suggests, there is something very special going on with numbers when it comes to the *Omer* and the *Yovel*. The Omer is seven times seven. On the fiftieth day we celebrate the waving of the Omer in Jerusalem. And, like on the fiftieth year of the Jubilee, something very special happens.

PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

Throughout the seven weeks, people have different practices that supplement the basic practice of counting off the days in the evening. Many people have a meditative practice of contemplating the seven qualities of the *Sefirot*: love, discipline, harmony, endurance, humility, bonding and leadership. Each week is used to contemplate just one of these, beginning with love, and each day it is paired with another attribute. This year I am thinking of studying commentaries on each of the 48 key attributes required for acquiring Torah (i.e. truly learning it) as they appear in Pirkei Avot 6:6 (page 678-9 of Koren-Sacks Siddur). Others might choose a good book like *The Middot: A Stairway of Virtues* by Ron Isaacs, or *Sefiros* by Yaacov Haber, or a book by Alan Morinis like *With Heart in Mind*. Or one might dedicate oneself to studying a classic work like *Duties of the Heart* by Bachya, *Mesillat Yesharim* by Luzzato or *Tomer Devorah* by Cordovero (now available in English translation).

I would like to ask each of you, reading this, to commit to engaging in a daily practice of learning during these fifty days. However, we do it, and whether we work on our basic emotions, refining our study of Torah itself or some other form of Torah study, the key is noticing our progression through the days of the Omer, and using them for a process of transformation that prepares us for the receiving of Torah. I will be trying this myself.

There is also another custom to keep in mind, for example to not to cut one's hair or beard. Hipsters rejoice ;) So it might be time to get a haircut beforehand! What is the lesson here? Maybe, wisdom grows day by day - just like a beard?

May we be individuals who engage in Torah study. May we each take this opportunity to refine and reflect upon our daily practice of Torah learning. May we be a congregation which prepares itself for a deeper freedom through continuous progress toward the goals of the journey from Passover to Sinai,

In the words of our Haggadah, "Let all those who are hungry come and eat. Let all who are needy come celebrate Passover with us." At Passover and all year long, our doors and gates are truly open for all those who want to taste the sweetness of Jewish life. We are all enriched by those who walk through our doors.

Please join us for the joint Shaaray Tefila – Temple Beth El Holocaust Remembrance service at the Synagogue on Tuesday May 10 at 7PM. Rena Bernstein, a holocaust survivor will be featured speaker.

El Yom HaShoah Special Service
and Program at Congregation
Shaaray Tefila on Tuesday Evening,
May 10, 2016, at 7:00 PM**

Holocaust Memorial Day will be commemorated this year with a service at Congregation Shaaray Tefila on Tuesday Evening, May 10, 2016, at 7:00 PM. Rena Bernstein will be our guest speaker and music appropriate to the occasion.

Rena was born April 7, 1938 in Krakow, Poland. Rena was four years old when her parents gave her to a family to hide in the forest.

Her parents (Jafa and Natan Wallach) spent 2 years with her mother's brothers hiding in a man-made cave 1.9 meters by 1.4 meters covered with wooden flooring. The Nazis used the building as a factory and the four had to be silent during the day and could only talk at night. After the liberation of Lesko, Rena's parents came to the forest to be reunited with their daughter. This Jewish community numbered about 30,000 before the war, after there were only 81 survivors. Rena was the only child survivor.

In 1959, Rena's mother, Jafa Wallach, got up early in the morning and wrote down her experiences of those 22 months of hell. When she was done with the manuscript, she put it away in a closet, where it stayed hidden for many decades. Rena took her mother's manuscript and turned it into a moving book, "Bitter Freedom," which she shares with school children throughout the area.

The public is invited and we urge you, our members, to show your support at this important time.
